The BHSU Remedy Student Scholarship Journal is a free, open-access journal in which Baptist University undergraduate and graduate students address issues of historical and contemporary concern to the healthcare and health sciences community. The journal aims to present well-researched scholarship, information, and perspectives in a style suitable for all readers. The university's undergraduate Honors Program facilitates the journal as one of many efforts to fulfill the program's Scholarship & Research Advancement Initiative.

To submit an article for consideration, contact the general editor, Dr. Paul T. Criss, at paul.criss@BaptistU.edu. Remedy covers a broad range of topics in health care and health sciences. The suggested article length is 2,000 to 6,000 words, including references, following the submission guide and the style manual that is appropriate to the author's discipline. A faculty member, a Faculty editorial team, and an Honors student editorial team review submissions. Articles are published in an annual electronic volume available on the BHSU website: www.baptistu.edu/honors-program.

Remedy Student Scholarship Journal published its inaugural edition Fall 2024. All issues of Remedy can be downloaded for free at www.baptistu.edu/honors-program.

Articles should be written in English following this submission guide and utilizing the style manual appropriate to the subject's discipline (e.g., AMA, APA, MLA, etc.). Submissions not formatted according to this submission guide will be considered, but the author may be requested to reformat the article before publication.

Remedy accepts quality articles published elsewhere, but republication rights and full details of the prior publication must be made available. Please provide a statement from the original publisher indicating permission for republication in *Remedy*.

Articles accepted for publication in *Remedy* cannot be published elsewhere (in print, electronically, or on the Internet) without the written permission of the editor, and not normally for a period of one year after the article's appearance in *Remedy*.

The preferred length of articles is 2,000 to 6,000 words, including citations and references (which should generally represent a maximum of 20 percent of the word count). Submissions should include the following:

- Title of article
- Name of author(s)
- Contact Information phone/email
- Brief synopsis (abstract) of the article's content
- Biographical data on the author, including the highest degree and where it was earned (if a previous degree has been earned).
- A statement indicating that this article has not been published or offered for publication before, or if it has, indicating the details and required permissions from previous publisher.
- Article text with citations and references following the style manual appropriate to the author's discipline.
- Statement indicating the **author's Baptist University faculty reviewer/primary program advisor** with **confirmation** from the faculty member that the article is appropriate for publication.
- Statement indicating the author's release to have the work published in the *BHSU* Remedy Student Scholarship Journal if approved for publication after consideration.

Articles should be submitted in Microsoft WORD format.

Tables and figures may be used if not overly complex. Make sure that any graphic or font is readable—supply **separate files** for each figure in .jpg format and at least 300 dpi. Insert the graphics in the relevant places in the manuscript with identifying captions. Any tables and figures used should be cited in the text before the place where they will appear.

Authorization to Publish

By submitting an article for consideration, the author is granting permission for the work to be published and releasing the work for publication under the auspices of the *Remedy Student Scholarship Journal*.

Remedy Student Scholarship Journal - Style Matters

Here are a few tips to make a submission easy to review and to copyedit:

Fonts: use 12-point Times Roman throughout.

Headings: The first level is centered, and the second level is flush left—bold, sentence case.

Paragraphs: Do not indent paragraphs. Set the Paragraph function in WORD to insert 6 points between paragraphs or skip a line between paragraphs to aid the readers.

Language: Remedy generally uses American English.

Quotations: Use double quotation marks first and then single quotation marks where necessary. Place the ending quotation mark before the punctuation **unless** the quotation constitutes a complete sentence, in which case the period precedes the ending quotation mark.

Long quotations (40 words or more) should be indented. Beginning and ending quotation marks should not be used.

Citation and References Cited Style: Follow the style manual utilized by your discipline within the University (e.g., AMA, APA, MLA, etc.)

Dates: use American style (e.g., March 31, 1972); include all digits in inclusive years (e.g., 1980 – 1984).

Numbers: spell out numbers less than ten and write Arabic numerals for numbers greater than ten (e.g., "12").

This is the Copyright Transfer Agreement that you will be asked to complete with the submission of your article that will become effective if your paper is accepted for publication.

Thank you for submitting your Contribution for publication. In order to expedite the editing and publishing process and enable the BHSU Honors Program to disseminate your Contribution to the fullest extent, we need to have this Copyright Transfer Agreement (the "Agreement") executed. If there are any co-authors of the Contribution ("Co-author"), you must obtain each Co-author's consent to the terms of this Agreement (including the rights granted to Owner) and obtain their signed written permission to execute this Agreement on behalf of the Co-author(s), and you must provide the written permission on request by the Owner. If there are no such Co-authors, terms related to Co-author(s) in this Agreement do not apply. If the Contribution is not accepted for publication, or if the Contribution is subsequently rejected before publication, this Agreement will be null and void. **Publication cannot proceed without a signed copy of this Agreement.**

Remedy: Student Scholarship Journal, as an open-access online e-journal, is an educational service provided to the community under the auspices of a not-for-profit educational organization (Baptist Health Sciences University Honors Program) to disseminate knowledge and advance research in healthcare and health sciences produced by students at the University. There is no cost nor remuneration to the authors for their Contribution.

For good and valuable consideration, including the publishing services rendered by the BHSU Honors Program and the mutual covenants and agreements herein, the parties agree as follows:

A. Copyright; Copyright Notice; Authorship; Publication

1. The Author and each Co-author hereby assigns to the Owner, during the full terms of copyright and any extensions for renewals, all copyright in and to the Contribution, and all rights therein, including but not limited to publish, republish, transmit, distribute, and otherwise use the Contribution in whole or in part in electronic and print editions of the Journal and in derivative works throughout the world, in all languages and in all media or expression now known or later developed, and to license or permit others to do so. In addition, the Author and each Co-Author hereby grants

to the Owner, during the full term of the copyright and any extensions or renewals, the exclusive, worldwide, irrevocable and fully transferable right to use and exploit the Contribution in any manner, including: the rights to reproduce, to distribute, to exhibit, and to make available to the public; the recitation performance, and presentation rights; the broadcasting rights; the rights of communication by video or audio recordings; the rights of communication of broadcasts and of works made available to the public. "Contribution" means the article submitted by the Author for publication in the Journal and all subsequent versions.

- 2. Reproduction, posting, transmission or other distribution or use of the final Contribution in whole or in part in any medium by the Author or any Co-author as permitted by this Agreement requires a citation to the Journal suitable in form and content and must include Title of the Article, Author and each Co-Author, Journal Title and Volume/Issue, Copyright year, copyright owner as specified in the Journal, and Publisher. Links to the final article on the publisher website are required where applicable/possible.
- 3. If any material contained in the Contribution is the output of Artificial Intelligence Generated Content (AIGC) tools, (a) such tools do not fulfill the role of, nor can they be listed as, an author of Contribution, (b) Author or Co-author will describe its use, transparently and in detail, in the methods, acknowledgment, or equivalent section of the Contribution (provided, however, no such description is needed for tools that are used to improve spelling, grammar, general editing), and (c) Author and each Co-Author is responsible for the accuracy of any information provided by any AIGC tool and for referencing any supporting work on which that information depends. The final decision about whether use of an AIGC tool Is appropriate or permissible lies with the Journal's editor or other party responsible for the publications editorial policy.
- 4. Notwithstanding acceptance, the Editors are permitted to require changes to the Contribution, including changes to the length of the Contribution. In addition, the Editors are permitted to elect not to publish the Contribution, and/or permitted to retract, withdraw, or publish a correction or other notice for a Contribution accepted for publication, if for any reason in the Editor's reasonable judgement, such publication would be inconsistent with the mission, vision, and/or values of Baptist Health Sciences University or the Core Practices and associated guidelines set forth by the Committee on Publication Ethics: https://publicationethics.org/core-practices or would result in legal liability, violation of BHSU's ethical guidelines, or violation of journal ethical practices.

B. Retained Rights

Notwithstanding the above, the Author and each Co-author retains all proprietary rights other than copyright, such as patent rights, in any process, procedure or article of manufacture described in the Contribution.

C. Permitted Uses by the Author and Co-Author(s)

- 1. Submitted Version. The Owner hereby licenses on a non-exclusive basis the following rights to the Author and each Co-author in the version of the Contribution as originally submitted for publication (the "Submitted Version"):
 - a. The right to self-archive the Submitted Version without embargo on: (i) the Author's and each Co-Author's personal website; (ii) the Author's and each Co-author's company/institutional repository or archive. This right extends to both intranets and the Internet. The Author and each Co-author may replace the Submitted Version with the Accepted Version, after any relevant embargo period as set out in paragraph C.2(a) below has elapsed. The Author or each Co-author may wish to add a note about acceptance by the Journal and upon publication the Author or each Co-author must add a Digital Object Identifier (DOI) link back to the Final Published Veersion.
 - b. The right to transmit, print, and share copies of the Submitted Version with colleagues, provided that there is no systematic distribution of the Submitted Version, for example, sharing through a listserv or email distribution list, network, or automated delivery.
- 2. Accepted Version. The Owner hereby licenses on a non-exclusive basis the following rights and each Co-author in the version of the Contribution that has been scholarly-reviewed and accepted for publication, but is not final (the "Accepted Version"):
 - a. The right to self-archive the Accepted Version on: (i) the Author's and each Co-author's personal website; (ii) the Author's and each Co-author's company/institutional repository or archive; (iii) Compliant Scholarly Collaboration Networks; and (iv) not for profit subject-based repositories, each of (i)-(iv) subject to an embargo period following publication of the Final Published Version of either 12 months for scientific, technical, and medical journals or 24 months for social science and humanities journals, provided that articles may be deposited in repositories on acceptance but access is subject to the embargo period.
 - The right to transmit, print, and share copies of the Accepted Version with colleagues provided there is no systematic distribution of the Accepted Version, for example, sharing through a listserv or email distribution list, network, or automated delivery.

- c. Dual publication in violation of journal ethical practices is not permitted.
- 3. Final Published Version. The Owner hereby licenses on a non-exclusive basis the following rights to the Author and each Co-author with respect to the final published version of the Contribution (the "Final Published Version"):
 - a. Copies for colleagues. The personal right to send or transmit individual copies of the Final Published Version in any format to colleagues upon their specific request and to share copies in private sharing groups provided no fee is charged, and further provided there is no systematic external or public distribution of the Final Published Version, for example, sharing through a listsery or email distribution list, network, or automated delivery.
 - b. Re-use in other publications. The right to re-use the Final Published Version or parts thereof for any journal or book publication authored or edited by the Author or any Co-author where such re-used material constitutes less than half of the total material in such publication. In such case, any modifications must be accurately noted.
 - c. Teaching duties.  - e. Nothing herein will permit dual publication in violation of journal ethical principles.
- 4. Article Abstracts, Figures, Tables, Artwork, and Selected Text (up to 250 words). The Owner herby licenses on a non-exclusive basis the following rights to the Author and each Co-author:
 - a. The right to re-use unmodified abstracts for any non-commercial purpose. For online uses of the abstracts, the Owner encourages but does not require linking back to the Final Published Version.
 - b. The right to re-use figures, tables, artwork, and selected text up to 250 words from their Contributions, provided the following conditions are met:
 - i. Full and accurate credit must be given to the Final Published Version.
 - ii. Modifications of the figures and tables must be noted. Otherwise, no changes may be made.
 - iii. The re-use may not be made for direct commercial purposes or for financial consideration to the Author or any Co-author.
 - iv. The re-use does not constitute dual publication in violation of journal ethical practices.

D. Copyright Notice

The Author, each Co-author, and company/institution agree that any and all copies of the Final Published Version or any part thereof distributed or posted by them in print or electronic format as permitted herein will include the notice of copyright as stipulated in the Journal and a full citation to the Final Published Version of the Contribution in the Journal as published.

E. Author's Representations

The Author represents that: (i) if the Contribution has multiple authors, the Author has informed each Co-author of the terms of this agreement, has obtained their signed written permission to execute this Agreement on their behalf, and will provide such written permission on request by the owner; (ii) the Author and each Co-author have the full power, authority, and capability to enter into this Agreement, to grant the rights and license granted herein and to perform all obligations hereunder; (iii) that neither the Author nor any Co-author has granted exclusive rights to, or transferred their copyright in, any version of the Contribution to any third party; (iv) the Contribution is the Author's and all Co-author's original work, all individuals identified as authors actually contributed to the Contribution, and all individuals who contributed are included; (v) the Contribution is submitted only to this Journal and has not been published before, has not been included in another manuscript, and is not currently under consideration or accepted for publication elsewhere; (vi) if substantial excerpts from copyrighted works owned by third parties are included, the Author shall obtain written permission from the copyright owners for all uses; (vii) the Contribution and any submitted Supporting Information contain libelous or unlawful statement, do no infringe upon the rights (including without limitation the copyright, patent, trademark rights) or the privacy of others, do not breach any confidentiality obligations, do not violate a contract or any law, do not contain material or instructions that might cause harm or injury, and only utilize data that has been obtained in accordance with applicable legal requirements and Journal policies; (viii) there are no conflicts of interest relating to the Contribution, except as disclosed.

The Author represents that the following information will be clearly identified in the Contribution: (1) all financial and material support for the research and work; (2) any financial interests the Author or each Co-author may have in companies or other entities that have an interest in the information in the Contribution or any submitted Supporting Information (e.g., grants, advisory boards, employment, consultancies, contracts, honoraria, royalties, expert testimony, partnerships, or stock ownership); and (3) indication of no financial interests if appropriate.

F. Use of Information

The Author and each Co-author acknowledge that, during the term of this Agreement and thereafter, the Owner may process the Author's and Co-author's personal data, including storing or transferring data outside the country of the Author's and Co-author's residence and sharing data with service providers, in order to process transactions related to this Agreement and to communicate with the Author and each Co-author, and that Owner has lawful basis in process the Author's and each Co-author's personal data. By entering into this Agreement, the Author and each Co-author agree to the processing of the Author's and Co-author's personal data.

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and complete understanding of the parties and supersedes all other agreements relating to the Contribution. By signing this Agreement, I agree to this Agreement and, where execution and delivery of the Agreement are electronic, I agree to such electronic execution and delivery and that an electronic signature will be given the same legal force as a handwritten signature.
