Up to 16 hours of block credit can be awarded based upon an individual Gap Analysis. A Gap Analysis will be completed on each applicant. Biostatistics and Epidemiology courses are required.

If current in advanced nursing practice, will not have to repeat advanced pathophysiology or advanced health assessment. Advanced Pharmacology will need to be repeated for any courses > 5 years old.

Block credit will be considered for the following courses: NSG 701, NSG 711, NSG 712, NSG 713 and NSG 721.
